The LAST Lower School Chapel is next Wednesday, May 14. Thank you for an incredible year together as we explored our theme of "Growing Deeper with God." It's such a blessing to be with your students each week. Below are the highlights from today's lesson.

In Christ, Ms. Lisa

Chapel Highlights:

- The lesson today was a review of the Holy Spirit. Who is He? He is God, a friend who helps and lives inside of me (See John 14:16-17). (Have your kids show you the motions.)
- When does the Holy Spirit come to live inside of us? After our salvation. When we admit we have sin, believe in Jesus and choose to follow Him, we are "saved." After that, our sins are forgiven, we get to go to heaven, and the Holy Spirit lives inside of us! (See Ephesians 1:13.)
- How does the Holy Spirit help us? He gives us comfort, points out our sins, and guides us.
- What objects did Ms. Lisa pull from her bag to help us remember how the Holy Spirit helps us? A blanket to represent the comfort He gives; a mirror to represent How He points out our sins; a compass to represent how He guides us.
- Grades 4-5 worshipped in song with "Count 'Em" by Brandon Lake. Before we sang, we talked through how this is a "scripture song," and it references verses from over 14 different books in the Bible.
- Grades 4-5 also had the privilege of seeing "The Gospel" in skit form. Grade 8 Middle School students who traveled to Belize for their mission trip learned and performed this skit to educate the people they ministered to while helping at the Libertad Methodist School. Dear parents,


I can hardly believe the end of school is on the horizon! For the remaining chapels, we will review some of the most important lessons from the year. Today's was, "Jesus is Fully Man and Fully God." **See below for why this is so critical to our faith**.

Thursday, May 1, was the National Day of Prayer (nationaldayofprayer.org), and we reviewed the Bible verse for this year which is Romans 15:13. We also missed having Grade 5 with us and can't wait to hear about their experience at IdRaHaJe. Finally, thank you to our PreK friends who joined this week and to our church friends, Ms. Carrie and Ms. Crystal, who helped lead Grade 4.

Lesson highlights:

- Hebrews 4:15 reminds us: "Our high priest (i.e. Jesus) is able to understand our weaknesses. He was tempted in every way that we are, but he did not sin." Jesus is fully human. That means He "gets us!" Everything we experience, He experienced too which is so comforting. Jesus also had to be fully human in order to be the perfect sacrifice for our sins.
- Hebrews 1:3 reminds us: "The Son reflects the glory of God. He is an exact copy of God's nature. He holds everything together with his powerful word." Jesus is also fully God. That means He can forgive sins. He also rose from the dead! That Jesus is alive means when we believe in Him, we will live forever in heaven with Him too.









HE IS RISEN! HE IS RISEN INDEED! Hope everyone had a special weekend celebrating the the crucifixion and resurrection of our Lord and Savior. Let us continually live as people with eyes fixed on Jesus.

SUMMARY of CHAPEL:

- Throughout this school year, we have focused on four, specific "Character Traits" showing SELF-CONTROL; offering KINDNESS; being PEACEMAKERS and having INTEGRITY. (See the definitions of each below.)
- We show our character with how we react to events in our lives. Having positive outward behavior is important. Yet, as Christ followers, we also want to focus on our hearts. Are we people who love God? Are we people who love others? The state of our heart provides the foundation from which our character stems from.
- After we are saved, our sins are forgiven, we get to go to Heaven and the Holy Spirit lives inside of us. One of the Holy Spirit's jobs is to help us practice good character and produce "good fruit." (See if your kids can SING the fruits of the Spirit from Galatians 5:22.)
- PERSEVERANCE. This is the last "Character Trait" for the year. Mrs. King, Mrs. Hicks and Mrs. Benn will be visiting grade level classrooms to explore this important trait with your students.

SUMMARY of CHAPEL 4/9.

- The Kidspoint Team came to announce VBS June 2-5 here at Cherry Hills Community Church. (See picture below.)
- Congratulations to Tristan Zaner (Grade 3) and Landon May (Grade 4) for making it to the finals of the ACSI Math Competition!
- Former student, Ella Johnson, came to lead the worship song, "Praise the King" using her gift of sign language. Thank you, Ella, for your time and servant's heart to bless Lower School students. (See picture below.)
- Ask your students if they remember the signs for "HALLELUJAH" (pointer fingers up in air then bend fingers; move hands in circles) and "ALIVE" (make "thumbs up" with both hands; place hands on stomach then move them up your chest).
- We reviewed the word, "scarlet." It's the word Isaiah uses to describe the stain and seriousness of our sin. (See Isaiah 1:18 below.) I used a red stained cloth then "washed" it in a bucket labeled, "Jesus" and pulled out a clean, white cloth to demonstrate the verse and emphasize the salvation message.

HAPPY EASTER! We didn't have regular Chapel on 4/16 due to Grandparents Day, but I wanted to offer blessings to your families as you celebrate both the crucifixion and the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ! Because He lives, we live also! (John 14:19). Ms. Lisa



Q&A

- What acronym and corresponding Bible stories did we use to explain how Jesus handled trials? C.P.R. - Cry. Pray. Read (Recite). When Jesus' friend died, Jesus cried - John 11. When Jesus was facing the cross, He prayed - Luke 22. When Satan tempted Jesus, He answered with scripture - Matthew 4. If Jesus did these things when He was having troubles, then we should too!
- What other Bible verse did we talk about? Romans 8:28. "We know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him."
- What visual helped to explain this scripture? An embroidery. The back side was unclear, messy, and had lots of knots. But the front side of the embroidery was a beautiful picture! That's like us and God. When we're in the middle of hard things, we see the mess, we often don't understand, and our stomach can even get into knots. Yet at the time, God is working for our good amidst the hard and has beautiful, clear plans for us. This is His promise to those who love Him!



TOPIC: WALK THROUGH THE BIBLE IN 12 PICTURES (Pt. 1)

As Christians, the Bible is our guidebook (Psalm 119:105). It gives us blessings like wisdom, instruction, details of God's promises, lessons about Jesus, and knowledge of how much God loves us! We know that we can't absorb this amazing treasure from God unless we READ IT. But sometimes that can be a challenge. There are many things that are hard to understand in the Bible. And the Bible is a HUGE book. That can feel overwhelming for younger and older readers alike.

For the next three weeks, we will be walking through the entire Bible using 12 pictures. The goal is for students to see that the Bible is one, overarching story. Students will also be able to summarize the Bible for themselves and start to better understand where the Bible stories they are reading fit into the big picture. Of course our ultimate hope and prayer is that our kids cultivate a deep desire to read the Bible and are transformed by the power of God's Word.

TOPIC: THE HOLY SPIRIT (Part 2)


This week, I was out of town but SO grateful that the Kidspoint staff at Cherry Hills Community Church came to substitute for Chapel.






TOPIC: THE HOLY SPIRIT

We had some great "Growing Deeper with God" discussions today as we dove into a lesson on the Holy Spirit. We also had an object lesson using a Hostess Ding Dong! See below for an explanation of that, other Q&A, and Bible verses from the teaching. In Grades 1-5 we also enjoyed our new, high intensity worship song called, "Goodbye Yesterday" (version by Doorpost Songs). And in Jr-K and Kindergarten Chapel, we were so glad to have our PreK friends and families join!

- The Holy Spirit is God! Jesus tells us who else the Holy Spirit is in John 14:16-17. What is a summary of this verse? (Full verse is below.) The Holy Spirit is... *a friend who helps and lives in me!*
- Summarize WHO the Holy Spirit is using hand motions. *The Holy Spirit is <u>God</u> (fingers point to sky)*, <u>a friend who helps</u> (sign language for friend) and <u>lives in me</u> (point to self).
- WHEN does the Holy Spirit come to live inside of us? (The apostle Paul helps to answer this in Ephesians 1:13. Verse is below.) *After our salvation! Once we admit to God that we have sin, that we believe in Jesus and choose to follow Jesus, not only are our sins forgiven and we get to go to Heaven, but also the Holy Spirit comes to live inside of us WOW!*
- HOW does the Holy Spirit get inside of us? The Bible does not tell us. It is one of God's
 mysteries.
- How did Ms. Lisa use a Hostess Ding Dong to help us understand this mystery? A Hostess
 Ding Dong looks like a simple chocolate cake from the outside, but when you cut into it, you
 discover it has a sweet, white filling. That's similar to us. We look the same on the outside
 after we receive Jesus, but on the inside we are filled with the Holy Spirit!

TOPIC: INTEGRITY

Chapel highlight:

We are always blessed to have Mrs. Bailey come and share a message! Today she taught on INTEGRITY, and the highlights are below for you to review with your family. Blessings, Ms. Lisa

- What is the definition of INTEGRITY and can you do the hand motions? (See slide below as well.)

 Doing what is right (thumbs up), no matter what ("hand jive" crossing arms), even if no one else is looking (hands make "binoculars").
- Mrs. Bailey had two stuffies on her shoulders an inspiration from the movie, *Emperor's New Groove*. What did the stuffies represent? *The battle we sometimes have in our minds about choosing between what is right and what is wrong*.
- We watched a video clip of a scene from Daniel 3 and the fiery furnace. Who shows great INTEGRITY in that story? Go back and read the full story as a family! Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego.
- The Bible gives us guidance about what pleases God when it comes to INTEGRITY. Review these scriptures with your family. *Proverbs 12:22; Psalm 119:29-30; Colossians 1:10*
- During prayer time, Mrs. Bailey asked us to focus on something in our own lives we struggle with that keeps us from having INTEGRITY. Some examples were lying or not doing what is asked of us or using unkind words. Share those as a family if you are comfortable.

FORGIVENESS

Truly understanding forgiveness comes with some tough realities and even some misconceptions. Along with our God Winks, worshipping through song, and dedicating time in prayer, we studied what the Bible says about forgiving others. Use the slides above and the Q&A below to continue discussions at home. Have a great weekend.

- 1. Sadly, we have all been hurt by others, usually with their words. Share a time when you were hurt by someone.
- 2. When someone hurts us, we often feel anger. And the anger can swell up in us. What prop did Ms. Lisa use to represent this? *A balloon she blew up*.
- 3. What can happen when we carry around anger toward someone? We are robbed of joy and peace. And our own behaviors and attitudes can be affected negatively. The Bible addresses how God does not desire for us to carry bitterness and anger. (Ephesians 4:25-27)
- 4. What was our definition of forgiveness? **Deciding to let go of the anger you have toward** someone who hurt you (represented by Ms. Lisa letting the air out of the balloon).
- 5. Saying, "I forgive you" means you choose to not hold onto anger against someone, but does it also mean that what the person did to you was ok? *No. Hurting others is never ok, and hopefully the person incurs some type of consequence.*
- 6. Is the other person apologizing part of the forgiveness equation? **No. Forgiveness is**something we choose to do. The other person may never apologize. Think of the people who were responsible for Jesus' death on the cross. They were never going to apologize, yet Jesus said to forgive them. (Luke 23:34)
- 7. Is forgiveness easy? **No. And forgiving doesn't automatically take away all of the sad and hurt.** We often need to ask parents or other trusted adults for help forgiving others. And the
 best thing to do is pray God is in the business of healing hearts, and He can give you
 wisdom about forgiveness if you ask!

Our "Growing Deeper with God" lesson was on loving God with all of our heart, soul, mind and strength. Please see the Q&A below to review the takeaways from this lesson with your family. Have a great week.

- 1. Where is heart, soul, mind and strength mentioned in the Bible? *All four are mentioned in Mark 12:30.*
- 2. Who spoke that verse and what kind of verse is it? *Jesus. It's a commandment.*
- 3. Jesus says that Mark 12:30 is a special commandment. Why? It's the GREATEST of them all!
- 4. How do we love God with all of our heart? Our heart is our feelings and emotions. We love God with our hearts when we feel love toward Him.
- 5. How do we love God with all of our soul? *Our soul is the deepest essence of our selves. We love God with our souls when we love from our truest, created self.*
- 6. How do we love God with all of our mind? Our mind is where we think and make decisions.

 We love God with our minds when we fill our brains with scripture, think about God actively throughout the day, and choose to do and say things that honor and obey Him.
- 7. How do we love God with all of our strength? Strength in this case refers to our actions. We love God with our strength when we serve Him, tell others about Him, use our gifts and talents wisely, and persevere when things are hard.
- 8. What was the big "takeaway" Jesus wants us to know? "Love God with ALL that you are and ALL that you have!" God doesn't want us to love Him a little. He wants us to love Him with our whole self every part of us!
- 9. Is loving God with "all that we are" easy? **No! We need to ask for His help with this. And, the more we learn about Him, the more we are able to love Him how He desires!**

REVIEWING LESSONS FROM GROWING DEEPER WITH GOD

It's so wonderful to be back! We reviewed some lessons from last semester (see Q&A below) and talked about things ahead for Chapel. We're still meeting in Room 115 (Treehouse) since the A/V is not ready in the new space in Room 170. Praying your break was wonderful, and God's blessings to you as we begin a New Year.

- 1. What does R.O.A.R. stand for? **R.O.A.R.** is our model of behavior and stands for Respect, Obey the Rules, Act Safely and be Ready to Learn.
- 2. Here at school, what do we call how God is working in our lives? **God Winks!**
- 3. What are some examples of where you can see God working? **Bible verses**; **friends**; **nature**; **worship music**; **healing and protection**; **schedules and timing**.
- 4. "Growing Deeper with God" is our theme for the year. What does that mean? We don't want to simply put knowledge about God in our heads! We want to take what we learn about Him and use it in our lives. We want to grow deeper in our relationship with God the Father and become more like Jesus every day.
- 5. What three lessons from last semester did we review? **The Bible is True**; **God is three persons** in one (**Trinity**); **Salvation**
- 6. What three "proofs" help us know the Bible is true? 1) Ancient Bible manuscripts match our current Bible with incredible accuracy. God's Word doesn't change! 2) Bible archeologists have found objects in the ground from Bible stories we read. 3) Throughout the Bible we see amazing fulfilled prophecies that could only be from the hand of God!

A PRAYER OF SALVATION



At the end of Chapel, I offered the opportunity for students to say a **PRAYER OF SALVATION**. Romans 10:9 says, "Declare with your mouth that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead and you will be saved." Check in with your kids. Some students have said a similar prayer already, some are still trying to understand what salvation is all about, and some decided to invite Jesus into their lives as their Savior! 1-2-3 Praise God!

First, we reviewed the message of salvation from the previous week. I reminded the students that in addition to the word, "SALVATION," they might know this message as, "THE GOOD NEWS" or "THE GOSPEL."

SALVATION is why we need Jesus. God is HOLY and we have SIN. The Bible teaches that our sin separates us from God the Father. But, the GOOD NEWS is that God loves us so much that He sent Jesus to die on a cross to take the punishment for our sin.

Finally, simply "knowing" the message of SALVATION isn't enough. The Bible teaches that we need, in faith, to **BELIEVE** in Jesus and who He is, **RECEIVE** the free gift of SALVATION and **CHOOSE** to follow Him. It's that simple! Use the graphics and Bible verses below to review the message of SALVATION with your family. It's the most important message of all!

CHOIR CLUB PERFORMANCE



Jesus says in John 14:6 "I am the way, the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me."

We talked about how simply knowing the message of SALVATION isn't enough. The Bible teaches that we need in faith to BELIEVE in Jesus and who He is, RECEIVE the free gift of SALVATION and CHOOSE to follow Jesus. Next week, I will review Bible verses about SALVATION and additionally provide an opportunity for students to say a prayer of SALVATION. Wherever your student is in their faith walk is where they're supposed to be! Some of our students have already a prayer of salvation, some are still trying to understand and aren't ready, and some want to say, "Yes!" to Jesus being their Lord and Savior.

UPCOMING EVENT/PROJECT

Please look at newsletter communications about next week's Lower School Food Drive to support the Thanksgiving outreach at His Love Fellowship Church. Every grade level brings a different food item on Wednesday, November 6. (Items listed below.) The pastors of His Love Fellowship will be our speakers in Chapel to explain how the students' food will go directly to people in need in downtown Denver. Thank you in advance for your donations. (Giving is always optional.)

NOVEMBER THEME: PEACEMAKER

Today, we did a "deep dive" with the character quality, **PEACEMAKER**. Everything we do in Chapel is rooted in the Bible, so first we looked at God's Word. "Let us do all we can to live in peace and let us work hard to build up one another." Romans 14:19. Peacemaking is an important skill and a call on our lives!

In order to explore **PEACEMAKING** further, walk through four steps of **CONFLICT** management and give a real-life example, Mrs. King, Mrs. Bailey and Ms. Lisa did a mini skit! (*Picture on page 2.*) The Q&A at the bottom gives the summary of what was communicated and can be a great conversation starter at home.

NOTE: Instead of the skit, Grades 4 and 5 had a heart-to-heart with Mrs. Bailey not only about **PEACEMAKERS** but also about **KINDNESS**. She asked the kids to be vulnerable about asking for help if they struggle being kind and asking for help if they have had unkind things said to them. We all make mistakes in relationships, but at CHC we want to hold ourselves to a high standard of kindness.

Q&A

- What is the definition of a PEACEMAKER? Someone who works through conflict to bring harmony (peace) to relationships.
- What is the definition of CONFLICT? A conflict is a disagreement between two or more people.
- Is conflict normal? Yes! Everyone has conflicts with others. Adults do too.
- Do you have to be yelling at another person to be in conflict? No. A conflict can be big or small disagreements.
- Is it best to avoid CONFLICT? No! Sometimes conflict can be uncomfortable. But it's important to NOT avoid it and instead learn how to resolve it in healthy ways.
- What are four steps to be a PEACEMAKER and work through a CONFLICT? STOP, SAY, SOLVE and WRAP UP WELL. (The symbols are on page 2. Can you also add the hand motions?)
- Can you give more details about each step? STOP and use techniques to get calm; SAY how you are feeling and what you are thinking. Be a good listener when the other person is sharing; SOLVE or brainstorm some possible solutions; WRAP UP WELL by choosing a solution and possibly saying/accepting apologies and giving/receiving forgiveness.
- Are these steps easy? No! It takes practice and God's help.
- If you get stuck, can you ask an adult for help? Yes!
- Does everything always work out smoothly? No! Sometimes you have to go back and try again.




LOWER SCHOOL I OCTOBER 9

TOPIC: THE MIRACLES AND PARABLES OF JESUS Blessings, Ms. Lisa

"Jesus performed miracles and taught in parables." That was our chant for the day. We discussed what miracles and parables are and why Jesus used them in His ministry. We also reviewed the importance and deeper spiritual meanings of three miracles and three parables. (See pictures at bottom.) Below are some questions and answers to promote discussion with your students.

- 1. What is a miracle? An extraordinary event that only God can do.
- 2. What is a parable? A simple story that teaches something about God. Jesus would use something practical or common in order to teach something spiritual or heavenly.
- 3. Did Jesus perform miracles to put on a show? NO! Why did Jesus perform miracles? *To show His love for people; to prove that He was God; to help others believe in Him.*
- 4. Why did Jesus use parables? They were a common way to teach in Bible times; the visuals helped people remember the stories; they made people think because the stories didn't always turn out how the people expected. Grades 4-5 also learned that Jesus teaching in parables fulfilled the prophecy from Psalm 78:2.
- 5. Are parables easy to understand? Not always. Even the disciples had to ask Jesus to explain them on occasion (Matthew 13:10-17 and Mark 4:10-12). The more we ask the Holy Spirit to reveal the deeper meaning of Jesus' parables, the more we will understand them!










LOWER SCHOOL LOCTOBER 2

TOPIC: JESUS IS FULLY MAN AND FULLY GOD Blessings, Ms. Lisa

Jesus is FULLY MAN and FULLY GOD. Grades 4 and 5 learned that Bible scholars call this the "hypostatic union." Why is this such a critical piece of the doctrine of Christianity? I put some questions and answers below to review with your students. "God was pleased to have his whole nature living in Christ. God was pleased to bring all things back to himself. That's because of what Christ has done...God made peace through Christ's blood, by his death on the cross." Colossians 1:19-20 NIrV

- 1. <u>How do we know that Jesus was a man?</u> The Bible tells us so! He was born as a baby and grew into a man. Other examples are that Jesus got hungry (Matthew 21:18), thirsty and tired. He was tempted and betrayed by others. Jesus was sometimes sad (John 11:35), sometimes mad, and He had very close friendships.
- 2. What is one reason why it's important to us that Jesus was a man? Jesus being fully human means He "gets us!" Everything we experience, He experienced too! (1 Timothy 2:5)
- 3. What is the key difference, however, between Jesus as a human and us as humans? Jesus did not sin. (2 Corinthians 5:21)
- 4. Why did Jesus need to be a man to fulfill God the Father's plan of salvation? Jesus had to die to be the perfect sacrifice. He died on the cross and was buried in the tomb. (1 Peter 2:24)
- 5. Why is it important that Jesus is fully God? Only God can forgive sins! Jesus also rose from the dead. That He is alive means when we believe in Him, we will live forever in heaven with Him too. (Matthew 20:28; John 11:25; John 14:19)







TOPIC: MUSANA and SHOW CHOIR Blessings, Ms. Lisa

The founders of **MUSANA** (our sister school/community in Uganda) gave the message in Chapel today! Andrea and Haril Kazindra (with the help of their CHC students, Dezi and Joziah) showed slides, some fun videos and held Q&A sessions with our students. We are deeply grateful for our partnership with Musana and how they bless us. We also pray blessings over them! Please ask your students three things they learned about Musana today.

Chapel is always special, and music is a big part of that. Today, Grades 4-5 had the opportunity to hear our Middle School **SHOW CHOIR** perform their song, "Faith" by Jordan Feliz. TOPIC: SHOFARS AND SUNDAES

Blessings, Ms. Lisa

The SHOFAR? The SUNDAE? It was a fun-packed, purposeful day! Please ask your students the questions below to learn more about what we covered in Chapel. Hope to see everyone at the Fall Family Night on Friday.

- 1. Who came to blow the shofar to open Grades 1-5 Chapels today? Mr. Lanting, Grade 8 Bible Teacher.
- 2. What did Mr. Lanting teach us about the shofar? Mr. Lanting's shofar was made from a ram's horn. Shofar is the name for "trumpet" in the Bible. The shofar was used for ceremonies and celebrations and as a call to battle. It was the shofars that blew when the walls of Jericho fell. Many Bible scholars also believe we will hear shofars when Jesus returns again. Grades 4-5 learned that the shofars blew for Temple sacrifice at 9:00am and 3:00pm, and the Bible tells us that Jesus was nailed to the cross at 9:00am and died at 3:00pm. What an amazing parallel Jesus was the ultimate sacrifice for our sins!
- 3. What did Mrs. Bailey and Ms. Lisa make on the stage today? *A GIANT ice cream sundae, complete with whipping cream, sprinkles, strawberry syrup and gummy worms.*
- 4. What did Mrs. Bailey use to ruin the ice cream sundae? MOTOR OIL!!
- 5. What character trait (which is also a fruit of the spirit) did Mrs. Bailey teach on today? KINDNESS
- 6. How does the object lesson of the sundae and the motor oil connect with kindness? CHC is like an ice cream sundae. We have so much good going on our wonderful building, our staff, our technology, our curriculum, our activities, our families and our students. Yet one act of unkindness (one drop of motor oil) can taint or spoil the good. We don't want to be like motor oil. We want to be sundaes!
- 7. What was the Bible verse today? *Colossians 3:12 "Therefore, as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience."*
- 8. How can you show acts of kindness specifically at school? How can you "stand up for kindness" at school? Can you commit to clothing yourself with kindness? It's a choice we make!





TOPIC: THE TRINITY and CHAPEL MUSIC VIDEOS Blessings, Ms. Lisa

I had such warm fuzzies after Chapels today! Our "Growing Deeper with God" topic was the **TRINITY**. (I put some questions below for you to ask your students.) We had beautiful praise and worship through **SONG**. (Below is how you can access all of the Chapel music videos.) And the highlight was hearing the kids share **GOD WINKS**! Thank you for continuing to help your students "go deeper" in the area of seeking and finding the unique ways God works in their lives.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS FOR HOME

- 1.Our God is three persons in one. Each is fully God and each is equally God. Who are the three persons? *God the Father, God the Son who is Jesus, and God the Holy Spirit.*
- 2. "Trinity" is the name that was chosen to communicate that our God is three persons in one. Is the word, "Trinity" in the Bible? No. It is a word that early church leaders came up with. But evidence of God as three persons in one is in the entirety of scripture.
- 3. Why did Ms. Lisa use the fidget spinner for a visual of the Trinity? *Just like a fidget spinner has three equal arms yet there's only one spinner, so our God is three persons in one God.*
- 4. Which person of the Trinity did we focus on today? God the Father.
- 5.Ms. Lisa highlighted four characters or qualities of God the Father. What are they? God is GOOD, HOLY, JUST and LOVE.
- 6. Which of those qualities is hardest to understand? Which is your favorite?

TOPIC: GOD WINKS and THE BIBLE IS TRUE PT. 2 Blessings, Ms. Lisa

Starting next week, the King's Kids will share God Winks. "God Winks" is a term we use for when we experience God working in our lives. Help your students to seek God Winks -- The Lord loves to show up in the most personal ways! Here are some examples:

- 1.A Bible verse that gave them new insight or a prayer that was answered. That's God!
- 2.A **friend** who appeared when they needed one. God works through people!
- 3.A **Christian song** whose words moved them in a special way. God communicates through music!
- 4. Seeing a beautiful rainbow or sunset or flower, etc. God reminds us about Him through **nature**.
- 5. A time God **healed or protected** them from harm. God is our shield!
- 6. An experience where God worked out the **timing or schedule** that otherwise seemed impossible. God is in the details!

The lesson was "The Bible is True – Part 2." I showed an ancient papyrus (P90) with excerpts from John 18 that match our current Bible, a Biblical archeology site that uncovered the Pool of Siloam where Jesus healed a blind man (John 9:11) and read the fulfilled prophecy from Micah that the Messiah would be born in Bethlehem (Micah 5:2). These "proofs" help us to know that the Bible is true!

We then talked about four things to do BEFORE reading scripture.

- 1. Pick a BIBLE. (Mrs. Bailey put some Bible purchase ideas on our Spiritual Life Hub if your child doesn't own a Bible.)
- 2. Pick a **PLAN.** (You don't HAVE to read the Bible start to finish though of course that's an awesome goal! It's ok to select a certain book of the Bible that interests you or research a topic like "the miracles of Jesus" or "friendship" for example. I have found Bible reading plans for kids on Amazon.
- 3. Pick a **TIME**. Help your kids choose the right time of day for Bible reading based on your family's schedule. A great goal is to be in the Word every day.
- 4. Pick a **PLACE**. Though again not required, sometimes having a special place to be with God encourages the reading. (I have my Bible study book and resources and Bibles by a certain couch in my home...My daughter created a Bible reading space in her closet, etc.)

Finally, once you're ready to read, here are some things to consider. (NOTE: Some of the kids will also be learning about Inductive Bible Study techniques in their Deep Roots curriculum.)

- 1. PRAY before you start to read the Bible. Ask the Holy Spirit to help you understand what you're about to read.
- 2. **READ** what you've selected for the day.
- 3.**ASK** and answer questions like...a) Who was speaking in the passage? b) What is the main lesson from the passage? c) What did you learn about God from the passage?
- 4. **PRAY** to close. Ask God to transform your mind by the reading of His word (Romans 12:2) and to help you use what you read in your life.





LOWER SCHOOL I AUGUST 28

TOPIC: SELF-CONTROL AND THE BIBLE IS TRUE Blessings, Ms. Lisa

What a great day in Chapel! We covered two important lessons. First, we welcomed Mrs. King to review the social/emotional learning unit on SELF-CONTROL. The Bible verses she referenced were Galatians 5:22-23 and Philippians 4:13. She used the "stop light" imagery to remind students to stop (red) if they are having a hard time with self-control, think (yellow) about what actions to take and then go forward (green) with good decisions. Parents, we hope you talk in your homes about self-control and encourage one another to develop this important fruit of the Spirit.

We also had a lesson on "The Bible is True." As Christians, we are to follow the teachings of the Bible, and the Bible is the basis for everything we do at school and in Chapel. So, believing the Bible is true is important! Here are four topics that give us confidence that God's Word is reliable:

- 1. **God says so!** 2nd Timothy 3:16 says, "All scripture is inspired by God." Moody Bible Institute explains this verse in this way: "God, through the Holy Spirit, used human authors to write what He revealed in the Bible."
- 2. **Old writings** (teaching visual was a pencil). If you compare the ancient Biblical manuscripts to our Bibles today, they match with incredible accuracy. Unlike the game of "Telephone" where words get jumbled over time, God's Word remains unchanged!
- 3. **Old things in the ground** (teaching visual was a shovel). When archeologists dig up objects referenced in the Bible or find evidence of things like Biblical cities or other structures, this helps us know the Bible is real history!
- 4. **Old messages** (teaching visual was a megaphone). In the Old Testament, God gave messages to prophets. Often those messages were about things that would happen in the future. Biblical scholars have concluded that around 2,000 of these prophecies that have been fulfilled! Only God could orchestrate those kinds of details.

"Growing Deeper with God" is our theme in Chapel this year. The final tie-in for our lesson was reminding all of us to use scripture in our lives to strengthen our relationship with God. But the kids were quick to answer that they won't know how the Bible is their guide to life unless they...**READ IT!!** Next week I'll include some tips on Bible reading.





LOWER SCHOOL I AUGUST 21

TOPIC: NEW YEAR, NEW THEME! Blessings, Ms. Lisa

My heart is so happy having everyone back in Chapel! Your being there means the world to me and to your kids. Thanks also for your flexibility and patience in our new space. Please see the notes below for what we covered today, and be sure to check out the Spiritual Life Hub in your Friday Newsletters.

Enjoy talking to your students about the following:

- 1. The theme for Lower School Chapel this year is "**Growing Deeper with God.**" What does that mean? (We don't want to simply acquire head knowledge about God. We want to apply His truths to our lives, grow in our relationship with Jesus and learn how to be more like Him every day.)
- 2. What musical instrument will Ms. Lisa use this year to start Chapels? (**SHOFAR**, a "horn" instrument used in Bible times and still today!)
- 3. Mrs. Dyer, Mrs. Bailey and Mrs. Melton visited today. What is Mrs. Melton's word for the year, and what scripture supports her word? (**HOPE**. Romans 15:13. "May the God of HOPE fill you with all joy and peace in believing, so that by the power of the Holy Spirit you may abound in HOPE...")
